CCA Competency Framework

The CCA Competency Framework outlines the scope of practice for continuing care assistants (CCA) in how they provide personal care and support for activities of daily living and instrumental activities of daily living. If you employ a CCA in your facility, the CCA Competency Framework offers consistency in service delivery and helps determine the scope of employment for certified CCAs in your facility. A certified CCA will enter your facility at an entry level, but as the CCA gains experience, the Competency Framework can assist in creating a challenging and rewarding work environment that meets the abilities of the CCA.
